


ABOUT THE PHOTOGRAPHY

Mayor Paul Montinieri's Message

This past year has been an exciting one for the Town of Wethersfield. We have engaged businesses in significant exchange of ideas, stimulated development, reconvened the Redevelopment Agency, and see notable progress on new initiatives.

We had a record turnout for our State of the Town, which was refashioned as a Business Growth Initiative. Over 120 attendees had a chance to meet State of Connecticut Economic Development staff and learn about support options to enhance their business growth.

Our "coffee with the Mayor" were very successful: many residents joining our council members for a coffee and idea exchange at various locations throughout town. This format proved to be popular, and anticipate seeing additional dates and times in the coming months.

Our budget passage went smoothly this year, maintaining a low cost of living tax increase, yet fully funding educational needs, initiatives and classroom support. In addition we boosted support and funding for road paving, something that was desperately needed following last years' rough winter and previous years' loss of ground on maintaining quality roads.

The high school renovation project is on time and proceeding toward a finish that will assuredly provide a quality facility as our flagship High School: new facilities, classroom space, science labs, sports facilities and fields. The work has not been without its challenges: however our leadership successfully pursued, and achieved an additional \$10 million in

state support to complete the project and the many needs unfolding to clean the property of hazardous materials. We successfully provided relief for our local taxpayers by partnering with our entire state Delegation: Representative Morin, Representative Guerrero, State Senators Doyle and Fonfara all contributed to the critical space waiver achievement that secured the continued progression of this vital renovation.

This coming year, we are very bullish on economic growth for Wethersfield. We have planted some vital seeds for redevelopment that we anticipate will yield important results in the coming month. This last year we welcomed dozens of new businesses to town: all of them contributing to strengthening our economic base and keep our business sites full and productive.

Please reach out to our council leadership at any time if we can be of help or assistance: our residents are active participants in shaping our goals and achievements, and we look forward to an exciting year ahead for our beautiful community.

VISION STATEMENT

WETHERSFIELD BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Wethersfield Board of Education has created and adopted a vision for the Wethersfield Public Schools that focuses on three areas of central importance to us:

- 1) Outcomes and opportunities for our students;
- 2) The overall quality of our school system; and
- 3) The school system's relationship with the Wethersfield community. Our vision in these three areas is best summarized by the following:

REFUSE AND RECYCLING

AUTOMATED RUBBISH COLLECTION

The Town provides each residence with a heavy duty barrel on wheels that is easily rolled to the street. Only refuse contained in the barrel will be collected. Residents have the option of leasing a second barrel for \$200 a fiscal year by contacting Paines, our refuse and recycling contractor, at 860-844-3003.

AUTOMATED RECYCLING COLLECTION

Single-Stream Recycling is here. All recycling items are to be placed in your recycling container provided by the Town. Only recyclables contained in the barrel will be collected. Recycled items include: glass jars, metal cans and aluminum foil products, milk and juice cartons, drink boxes, newspapers, magazines, junk mail, office paper, chipboard, and corrugated cardboard. Catalogs, junk mail, magazines, shredded & office paper, newspapers, junk mail and plastics (#1-#7). As of February 2013 additional recyclable items can be put in your 95 gallon barrel or brought to the Transfer Station. These items include some of the following: large toys, beverage carts, laundry baskets and telephone directories. The complete list is available on the Town's website. Residents can request a 2nd recycling barrel, free of charge, if residents fill more than one recycling barrel every two weeks. Recyclable items may also be brought to the Transfer Station. Recycling is picked up every other week. The schedule is located on the Town's website, Paine's website www.painesinc.com or by calling Paines 860-844-3003. Routes start early, barrels should be out by 7:00 am.

FURNITURE & BULK ITEM FEES

Residents should call Paines (860-844-3003) to schedule a bulk item collection at their home. Paines charges \$25 for up to 5 bulky items. Some examples of bulk items include: furniture and rugs. Mattresses can be picked up by Paines for an additional \$25 per mattress.

APPLIANCES

For curbside pick-up of appliances (e.g. stove, refrigerator, freezer, air conditioner, hot water heater, dishwasher, washer, dryer) residents purchase a White Goods Sticker at the Transfer Station. The pick-up of appliances are scheduled for Monday mornings at 7:00. State law requires that doors be removed from refrigerators and freezers before they are left curbside. Residents may bring stoves, dishwashers, hot water heaters, washers, and dryers to the Transfer Station at no charge. Appliances that contain Freon are charged \$10.

TRANSFER STATION

The Transfer Station is located at 100 Marsh Street and is open Monday & Friday from 9 AM to 2:45 PM and Saturday from 8 AM to 3:45 PM. With a permit residents may bring the following items free of charge to the Transfer Station: metal items; auto, marine & lawn batteries; brass, copper, aluminum, cast iron sinks & bathtubs; radiators, large pieces corrugated cardboard, hydraulic fluids, kerosene, motor oil, CFLs and electronics. All items that are recycled at the curb can be brought down to the Transfer Station. Residents are not required to have a permit in order to drop off leaves.

STREET LIGHT REPAIR

Residents can report a street light out by logging on to the www.cl-p.com website or by calling 860-947-2000.

HOLIDAY DELAYS

If a holiday falls during the week there will be a day delay in pick-up.

Delays in curbside refuse collection are noted on this calendar and typically include: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. The refuse/recycling company, Paines, has a motto of "when in doubt, put it out."

TRANSFER STATION

Wethersfield residents using the Transfer Station require a permit, except to pick-up mulch or drop off leaves. Rates as of July 1, 2013:

½ cu. yd. of disposal is measured as to what typically fits in a 95 gallon MSW container, considering density of the contents, e.g. construction matter versus brush. A list of acceptable items is listed on the town's website. New recycling containers at the Transfer Station include: *Electronic containers - e.g. computers, monitors, printers, televisions, toasters and vacuums. *Book Recycling - hard and soft cover. *Clothing Container - clothes, curtains, bedding and shoes.

PHYSICAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

CHRISTMAS TREE DROP OFF

The Town does not pick up Christmas trees curbside. Residents can drop off their Christmas trees at collection points around Town, including the Transfer Station.

CURBSIDE LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULE

In the fall, during a published period of time, Town Employees will be out collecting leaves. Residents should have their leaves raked to curb by the first day of collection in their area. Leaves should be raked in a long row about three feet high and placed on the snow shelf behind the curb, not in the street. Piles must be free of any foreign matter, such as large tree branches and stones. The Town will not make individual spot pickups of leaves. Residents who do not have their leaves raked to curbside by the time of collection in their area must compost them or take them to the Transfer Station at 100 Marsh Street.

The Town reserves the right to refuse loads which are not suited for disposal in the Transfer Station. Examples of refused loads include: large tree stumps, fill, stones and cement. The Transfer Station does not accept any hazardous materials. Additional information is found at www.wethersfieldct.com.

SNOW REMOVAL

STREETS

It is the town's responsibility (or the state's if a state highway e.g. Route 3 Maple Street) to clear snow from streets and make them passable for public use. First the town opens the road, making one swipe down the middle from each side of the road. Once they've done this throughout the whole town they then go back and widen the road. Residents shouldn't clear their driveway aprons until the roads have been widened or the aprons will fill in with heavy wet snow from the streets.

SIDEWALKS

It is the owners responsibility to clear the snow from the sidewalks within 24 hours after the snow or ice storm ends.

FIRE HYDRANTS

It is the owners responsibility to clear around the fire hydrant within 24 hours after the snow storm ends. The accumulation cannot be left more than four inches below the bottom of the lowest outlet on any fire hydrant. Snow must be cleared within a radius of three feet from the center of the hydrant, and a path three feet wide made to the street.

DRIVEWAYS

When you or your landscaper clears your driveway they cannot push the snow across the street and deposit it in front of your neighbors house. The town must push back snow as far as it can. This practice can occasionally deposit large quantities of snow on the driveway apron. This can't be avoided. One thing residents can do to minimize the snow on their driveway apron is to pile shoveled snow to the right as you face the street. That way the shoveled snow will be carried down the street and not pushed back into the driveway.

MAILBOXES

In order to provide a fair and uniform resolution to disputes involving mailboxes damaged by town snowplow and snowplows contracted by the town to plow town roads, the Wethersfield Town Council established the following policy concerning repair/replacement of mailboxes:

- All mailboxes should be securely fastened to a sturdy post which is sufficiently anchored in the ground to resist the impact of plowed snow.
- In accordance with current postal guidelines, the mailbox should be at least nine (9) inches from the curb or edge of pavement in order to prevent contact by the snowplow itself. The height of the bottom of the mailbox should be between 42" and 48" from the road surface.
- If it is determined a mailbox was struck by a town snowplow, the town will reimburse the owner \$25 for the post and \$15 for the box. The town will not repair or replace any mailbox.
- No mailbox or post will be considered for the damage reimbursement if the post shows dry rot or is otherwise unstable.
- The town will reimburse the owner for damage to the mailbox and/or post only when the town's snowplow is found to have made direct contact with the mailbox, not

when the box is knocked over by snow or slush that is pushed by the plow.


SAND

Sand is available for residents to use on their sidewalks and driveways. You can pick it up at two locations, the Transfer Station at 100 Marsh Street and beyond the tennis courts at Millwoods Park. Sand is available in the Transfer Station the beginning of November and in Millwoods Park once we finish picking up leaves from curbside (normally, the beginning of December).

PUTTING SNOW ON THE STREET

Per Town Ordinance

"No person shall lay, throw, blow, place or plow or cause to be laid, thrown, blown, placed or plowed on or into any public street or way any snow or ice from any private property, public or private sidewalk or public right-of-way. If, in the removal of snow or ice from any such property, sidewalk or way, it is necessary to temporarily place snow or ice on any public street or way, such snow or ice shall immediately be removed from the public street or way by and at the expense of the person causing such deposit. The penalty for each violation shall be \$50 and each and every 24 hours period of failure or neglect to comply with the provisions of this section shall be deemed a separate offense or violation."



SOCIAL AND YOUTH SERVICES

The Social and Youth Services Department is responsible for assisting residents with social, emotional, and economic needs, and the coordination of resources to improve the quality of life. Some of the specific functions of the department include: the coordination of programs and services for the elderly and persons with disabilities, including transportation services (see below) and a daily nutritional luncheon program; fund raising campaigns for the special needs fund and camp fund; food, clothing and fuel bank for residents; coordination of volunteer services; information and referral; crisis intervention; advocacy for youth, adults, seniors and the disabled; juvenile diversion program; and positive youth development and primary prevention programs.

- **Food Bank** is available by appointment Monday-Friday, 8 AM - 4 PM. Proof of residency and income are required.
- **Mobile Foodshare** (fresh fruits and vegetables) comes to the Housing Authority on Lancaster Road every other Wednesday from 9-9:30 AM.
- Social & Youth Services sponsors a **WIC** site on the Ground Floor level of the Town Hall one Monday each month. Clients must meet eligibility guidelines and must be registered with the Hartford WIC office.
- The Wethersfield Social & Youth Services Department operates a **Senior Center** at the Pitkin Community Center serving

seniors 55 years and older. The Center offers social, educational, entertainment, health and wellness programs. Three year membership is \$10 for Wethersfield residents.

- **The Senior Café/CRT Lunch Program** is available at the Pitkin Community Center and operates Monday through Friday providing a hot lunch for seniors and their caregivers. Suggested donation: \$2.50 for ages 60+. Fee: \$5.00 for under age 60. To make a reservation, call 860-721-2955 one day ahead between 10 AM and 12 noon.
- The Department sponsors the **CRT Energy Assistance** program from October-April each year.
- Renter Rebate program is available April-October each year.
- Department staff assists with open enrollment for **Medicare Insurance Plans and Part D** October 7 through December 15th each year
- **Volunteers** are needed to be Friendly Shoppers and Friendly visitors for elderly who are housebound or disabled
- **Dial-a-Ride** is available by subscription to those over 60 or people with disabilities who need rides for medical and other appointments. Cost is \$78 per year.



FALSE ALARM ORDINANCE

In accordance with the False Alarm Ordinance as approved by the Town Council, any home or commercial establishment that has a burglar and/or fire alarm system must be registered with the Wethersfield Police Department. The registration fee is \$25.00. Residential alarms must be renewed every three years and commercial alarms must be renewed annually. You can obtain a registration form at the Police Department, Town Hall and the Town's website.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE ORDINANCE

Residents are reminded of the following:

1. Properties over grown with tall grass and bushes must be cut and maintained on a consistent basis; in the front/rear yards.
2. You can't have any unregistered vehicles on your property.
3. Bulk furniture pick up should be not be put out at the curb until the day before bulk pick up.
4. You cannot have unsightly materials (garbage) on your property. It must be property stored.
5. Illegal signs - signs posted within the Town's right-of-way are not allowed and will be removed by the Town.




