

The road network is designed so that a connection can be made to an abutting subdivision located north of the property. The developer has also provided 3.6 acres of open space that abuts the Town owned 1860 Reservoir. Plans are available for review in the Planning Department.

E. PROJECT UPDATES:

ENGINEERING

- **Putnam Bridge Restoration:** DOT designing bike trail connections for Wethersfield and Glastonbury sides.
- **Wethersfield High School Building Committee:** Auditorium given Certificate of Occupancy. Final cleaning and sound balancing next week for turnover. Painting and ceilings continue in classroom wing.
- **Radio System:** Most punch list items have been satisfied. Town staff met with Harris representatives and the Town's radio consultant to discuss plans for final items.
- **CRCOG Bus Shelter Replacement Project:** Contractor to begin construction in the spring.
- **CREC Discovery School:** TPZ working with CREC staff on rooftop HVAC screening.
- **Main/Marsh/Church Intersection:** Spring replanting of lawn as required.
- **CT DOT Traffic Signals:** Staff working with DOT on input for signal upgrades. Final plans in for Silas Deane Hwy @ Mill Street and Wells Road @ Willow Street.
- **Montinero Field Drainage:** Completed. Touch up of settled areas and grass within the next few weeks, weather permitting.
- **BOE Security Doors Elementary Schools:** Bids awarded for Emerson Williams and the front entry of Charles Wright.
- **Mulchsealing:** Public Works Committee evaluating continuation of this program.
- **Emerson Williams Front Sidewalk Repairs:** Wespro working on.
- **Millwoods LL Parking Lot:** All stone and grading completed; paving around island in April.
- **LED Streetlights:** Staff reviewing three firms for light purchase and LED conversion.
- **Spring Paving:** Preparation work has begun. Milling scheduled to begin April 25, 2016. Paving to follow.
- **Wayfinding signs:** Project ramping up for the replacement of signs at the town building and completion of welcome signs.
- **Dam inspections:** GZA dam engineers to review and scope inspection of 9 town owned dams per DEEP requirements.
- **Route 175/Russell Rd:** CT DOT exploring concept of curbed islands for safety channelization from southbound off ramp off Rt. 15.

SUBJECT: **March 2016 Violation and Zoning Report**

Summary:

Attached please find a zoning violation and property maintenance report for the months of January through March 2016. Through March 31st, I have received information about or noticed for myself 82 violations throughout Wethersfield (47 of which being property maintenance violations, the remaining 35 being zoning violations). In March alone, I received/noticed 18 zoning violations and 29 property maintenance issues. Of those received in March, I am happy to report that 33 issues have been resolved, another 13 are in progress, and one is pending further research. There are still two outstanding issues from January and February, one of which has reached the citation phase of enforcement, and the other has applied to the Zoning Board of Appeals for a variance.

There has been a significant increase in working with the public at the counter to assist with questions regarding zoning for projects such as additions, decks, pools, etc. The spring weather will likely bring about more of this type of interaction for upcoming projects.

One case was heard by the Zoning Board of Appeals in March, for an attached garaged extending past building lines at 14 Warner Place. The case was approved. Two cases are scheduled for the April ZBA meeting; one for a variance to allow a two family home in a single family zone at 32 Garden Street, and one to allow the keeping of chickens closer to the street line than permitted.

As Fishing Season Kicks Off, DPH Touts Benefits of Fish Consumption

Hartford – As the local fishing season gets underway, the Connecticut Department of Public Health (DPH) wants to remind anglers and the general public of the benefits of fish consumption. Both local and store-bought fish contain beneficial nutrients, such as fish oils, which can help brain development and prevent heart disease. Other beneficial nutrients include iodine, selenium and protein.

“Previous warnings about toxic chemicals in fish have alarmed the public and scared some people away. We are now learning there are plenty of healthy fish to eat, even during pregnancy. A little forethought about which fish you are taking home is all you need to make a smart choice,” said Brian Toal, DPH Epidemiologist. “DPH has studied the risks and benefits of different species which has allowed us to give the public, particularly women of childbearing age, sound advice on healthy fish choices.”

Recent studies have shown that fish consumption during pregnancy can improve children’s learning and IQ. However, DPH warns that choosing the right fish is important since some varieties of fish can still contain higher levels of contaminants such as PCBs and mercury.

DPH’s list of healthiest fish choices includes trout and sunfish from the state’s freshwater bodies, flounder (winter and summer varieties) and scup (porgy) from Long Island Sound, and wild salmon and pollock from the grocery store. DPH has identified these as beneficial species that can be consumed without limit. The Department’s fact sheets and website provide the complete listing of healthy fish choices.

While emphasizing what’s good to eat, DPH also alerts the public to local water bodies and species that contain too much contaminant to be eaten safely. The advice varies between the general public and pregnant women for these more highly contaminated species. For example, swordfish can be safely eaten once a month by the general public but not at all by women of child-bearing age. Similar restrictions are placed on bluefish and striped bass from Long Island Sound. Additionally, DPH has specific advisories for 14 freshwater bodies in Connecticut due to local contamination sources. Anglers should keep the DPH publication, *If I Catch It, Can I Eat It*, handy when deciding where to fish.
