## E. PROJECT UPDATES:

### **HARTFORD AVENUE ROAD CLOSURE**

- **Pipeline project September 13 – 18, 2016:** Buckeye Pipeline will be replacing pipeline running across Hartford Avenue and south of the Route 5 & 15 bridge. This project will necessitate the closure of Hartford Avenue from Jordan Lane to the Hartford line from September 13-18, 2016. Traffic will be detoured around the area.

### **ENGINEERING**

- **Middletown Ave Safety Improvements:** Staff submitted an application to CRCOG for construction funding through the 2016 CTDOT Local Road Accident Reduction Program for the area located at the south end of Middletown Ave near the Rocky Hill town line. The project was not selected for funding under this program; therefore, staff will be assessing other funding options for completing the improvements.
- **MDC Goff Brook Overflow Project:** Staff met with the MDC and their consultants to review the construction plans and schedule. MDC is currently reviewing bids and plans to start construction this fall or next spring.
- **Dam inspections:** GZA GeoEnvironmental has been contracted to review and inspect nine town-owned dams per Ct DEEP requirements. The consultant is scheduled to begin researching records next month and complete inspections this fall.
- **LED Streetlights:** Staff is reviewing three firms for light purchase and LED conversion.
- **CT DOT Traffic Signal Improvements at Wolcott Hill Rd & Wells Rd and Maple St & Mill St Intersections:** Construction has commenced and DOT anticipates completing improvements this fall.
- **MDC Project on Byrd Rd, Somerset St and Chamberlain Roads:** Contractor is hot sealing pavement joints and replacing pavement markings.
- **Reservoir Estates Subdivision:** Construction within the Phase 1 limits has commenced.
- **CRCOG Bus Shelter Replacement Project:** Contractor is expected to begin construction later this year.


