### **SOCIAL & YOUTH SERVICES:**

- **Energy Assistance Program:** The Connecticut Energy Assistance Program (CEAP) is now open around the State. The program is designed to help off-set the winter heating costs of lower income households, especially those incomes that fall at or below 150% of the federal poverty guidelines; as well as households with elderly, disabled and/or children under the age of 6 with incomes between 150% and 200% of the federal poverty guidelines. Guidelines (based on the 2016 year): Family of 1 - \$33,132.22; Family of 2 - \$43,326.74 and Family of 3 - \$53,521.27. Wethersfield residents that are Renters may have \$12,000.00 or less in liquid assets and Homeowners may have \$15,000.00 or less in liquid assets. Wethersfield residents that fall within the guidelines may make an appointment with Social and Youth Services Department by calling (860) 721-2977. All applications are completed by appointment only.
- **Weekend Youth Meal Program:** If you have children in your home and are experiencing some financial hardship please contact Social & Youth Services about our new Weekend Youth Meal Program. A caregiver would be responsible for picking up a bag of food every Thursday or Friday. These bags would be filled with breakfast, lunch, dinner and snacks for the kids to eat on the weekends.

The Town anticipates the work will be completed this fall by the Town's sidewalk and line striping contractors.
- **Highland St, Two Rod Hwy & Hang Dog Lane Safety Improvements:** The Town anticipates installation of new sidewalk ramps and crosswalks at this intersection will be completed this fall by the town's sidewalk and line striping contractors.
- **Sidewalk Construction and Repair Program:** Replacement of existing concrete sidewalks along Town properties and replacement and installation of sidewalk ramps throughout Town will commence next week.
- **Pavement Marking Program:** Restriping of stop bars and crosswalks throughout Town has commenced.
- **Crack Sealing Program:** Work is complete.
- **Wilkus Farm Parking Lots:** Town staff is in the process of constructing three gravel parking areas that will be located off Willow Street, Goff Road and Thornbush Road.

- **Reservoir Estates Subdivision:** Contractor has begun installation of sanitary sewer, water distribution and drainage system improvements within Phase 1 construction limits.

### **SPECIAL PROJECTS/ACHIEVEMENTS/INNOVATIONS:**

- In partnership with the Keane Foundation and schools, the new Keane on Kids After School Enrichment Programs kicked off in September. Children in the elementary schools now have the opportunity to register for programs that take place right after school – in their home school. Programs include cooking, gym games, yoga, art, music, drama, dance, chess and Mad Science. Combined with the existing Running Club program and After School gym programs, approximately 800 children are engaged in the programs this fall.

### **MONTHLY ACTIVITIES:**

- Registration for fall programs began.
- Cove boating season continues.
- Field use continues with Eagles Football, Little League, Men's Softball, George D. Ritchie Soccer Club, and Wethersfield Youth Field Hockey Club.
- Fall classes began this month including Afternoon Athletes, Afterschool Mini Movers, Fitness Classes, Golf Lessons, Keane After School Programs, Running Club,

- Special Olympics Unified Bowling, Basketball and Tennis programs began for the season. Unified Golf athletes had quite a month. Six teams participated in the Special Olympics State Fall Sports Classic on September 11<sup>th</sup>. They received a gold medal, silver medal, 4<sup>th</sup> place ribbon and three participatory ribbons. Two of the six teams went on to Port St. Lucie at the end of the month for a National Tournament.
- Therapeutic Recreation began the after school program. Participants have enjoyed yoga, cooking, games, croquet and art projects. Adults enjoyed a visit to the casino and walked the West Hartford Reservoir ending with lunch at Wood 'n Tap.
