




# Welcome to Wethersfield

# STORMWATER PERMITTING REQUIREMENTS

Residents should be aware the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) stormwater permit for municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s) requires the Town to reduce the amount of stormwater that enters our storm systems and downstream areas.

Residents can help with this mandate by disconnecting roof downspouts that discharge directly to the Town's drainage systems, driveways, roadways or other impervious surfaces, and redirecting rainwater to lawn areas, landscape beds and other surfaces that allow for infiltration.

To disconnect your downspouts, just follow these simple instructions:

Did you know approximately 1,200 gallons of water flow from a single house (~2,000 sq ft) during a 1 inch rainfall? That is a significant amount of water going down the storm sewer system into our streams! Disconnecting a roof drain is a simple and low maintenance alternative that directs stormwater away from storm sewers and promotes infiltration. Directing downspouts onto a lawn or vegetated area will reduce the amount of water and pollution entering a receiving waterbody. Before rerouting your downspout, it's important to check with your Municipality for permission based on their spacing requirements for stormwater runoff. If rooftop disconnection is ideal for you, then the following steps will help towards this goal:


# **Observe Your Property**

- Know your property lines, don't direct runoff toward your neighbors!
- Be aware of the slope of your yard, water will rarely infiltrate on slopes over 10%.
- Measure the amount of lawn available for downspouts to direct water to.
- Keep in mind safety when routing downspouts onto pervious surfaces. Avoid downspout extensions across sidewalks and driveways.

# **Disconnection Design**

- · Direct downspouts towards grass or landscaped areas.
- Downspouts can also be connected to rain barrels or drain into a rain garden or stormwater planter.

- The downspout extension should be at least 2ft away from a house without a basement and 6ft minimum from a house with a basement.
- The standpipe which connects into the sewer system should be capped or plugged.
- A splash guard or stone bed can help prevent erosion during intense storm events.



# Maintenance

- Clean gutters and downspouts, especially during the fall, to prevent clogging.
- Make sure gutters are sloped to direct water toward downspouts.
- Inspect area in which downspouts drain to; make sure there is no standing water.
- Ensure that elbows and sections of downspout are properly connected.







# **SNOW REMOVAL**

#### **STREETS & SIDEWALKS**

- It is the Town & State responsibility to clear snow from streets and make them passable.
- Property Owners are responsibly to clear snow from sidewalks within 24 hours after storm ends.

#### **FIRE HYDRANTS**

- Property owners are responsible for clearing area around fire hydrant within 24 hours after a storm ends
- Accumulation must be minimum of 4 inches below lowest outlet
- Clear a radius of 3 feet from center of hydrant and 3 foot wide path to street

#### MAILBOXES—DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- Box must be securely fastened to a sturdy post, sufficiently anchored in ground to resist impact of plowed snow
- Box should be at least nine(9) inches from curb to edge of pavement to prevent contact with snowplow. Bottom of mailbox should be between 42"-48" from road surface
- Owner will be reimbursed only when Town's snowplow is found to have made direct impact with mailbox, not when box is knocked over by snow or slush pushed by plow
- If determined that box was struck by Town plow, Town will reimburse owner \$30 for post and \$20 for mailbox.
   Town does not repair or replace mailboxes

## **AUTOMATED REFUSE COLLECTION**

- One (1) barrel provided to each resident for refuse
- Only refuse contained in this barrel will be collected
- Refuse is collected weekly and barrels should be placed at curb by 7am
- 2nd barrel may be leased from Paine's for \$275/fiscal yr

#### **BULK ITEMS & FURNITURE**

- Contact Paine's to schedule pick-up. Fees may apply.

# **TOWN ORDINANCE (SNOW ON STREET)**

"No person shall lay, throw, blow, place or plow or cause to be laid, thrown, blown, placed or plowed on or into any public street or way any snow or ice from any private property, public or private sidewalk or public right-of-way." "The penalty for each violation shall be \$50 and each and every 24 hour period of failure or neglect to comply with the provisions of this section shall be deemed a separate offence of violation." (full language of ordinance available on website)

## **AUTOMATED RECYCLING COLLECTION**

- One (1) barrel provided to each resident for recycling
- Only recycling contained in this barrel will be collected
- Recycling is collected <u>every other week</u> and barrels should be placed at curb **by 7am**
- Recyclable items may also be brought to Transfer Station
- 2nd barrel may be requested free of charge from Paine's

#### **RECYCLING AT TRANSFER STATION**

- Any items recycled at curb plus additional items may be brought to Transfer Station
- Please see website for a complete list of items & fees
- Town reserves the right to refuse loads not suited for disposal at Transfer Station. (ex. Large tree stumps, fill, stones, cement).
- Hazardous Material are not accepted
- Donation containers also available for clothing, home goods, and books.

#### **CURBSIDE LEAF COLLECTION**

- Curbside collection is offered for leaves that are raked in a long row about 3 ft. high behind curb (not in the street)
- Piles must be free of any foreign matter like branches or stones)




